2017 NE - Y8 MIXED SCHOOLS' VISUAL ART WORKSHOPS INFORMATON FOR TEACHERS

WHAT ARE MIXED SCHOOLS' VISUAL ART WORKSHOPS?

Mixed schools' workshops are designed so that a teacher can send a small number of students along to Southland Museum & Art Gallery visual art workshops, without having to go through the process of booking in a whole class and arranging relieving teachers, buses etc.

Students participate in the visual art workshops alongside students of the same age from other schools.

Many teachers use these workshops as a way of enriching the skills of students who show talent or who are particularly enthusiastic about art.

WHY SHOULD I SEND SOME STUDENTS ALONG?

In these workshops, students get to view and appreciate art on display, develop new skills and communicate their own ideas through art. They are also offered the opportunity to interpret the experience, as well as their own and others' work.

HOW MANY STUDENTS CAN I SEND TO EACH WORKSHOP?

Around 1 – 8 students, although you may be able to send more, depending on the popularity of the workshop. Numbers for each workshop are limited, however extra workshops can be held to meet demand.

DO THE PARENTS NEED TO ATTEND THE WORKSHOP?

For NE-Y3, an adult will need to stay and assist for the duration of the workshop. The adult to student ratio is 1:8. For example, if you send two carloads of students along, with each car containing four students, only one of those parents will need to stay with the eight students. If you send fewer than eight students, the parent should be prepared to stay, but may be able to pop away if there are other adults available to make up the ratio.

For Y4-8, parents need to escort the students to the Museum classroom but do not need to stay for the workshop. However parent help is always appreciated. One parent from each school group will need to sign a form to verify student numbers. Students will not be released at the end of the workshop until a parent has come in to collect them.

HOW DO I BOOK MY STUDENTS INTO A WORKSHOP?

Teachers must book in their students at least one week before the workshop. If the number of students you have booked changes, please notify Kirsty ASAP as this may affect lesson preparation and/or there may be other students on a waiting list.

WHAT TIME DO THE WORKSHOPS START AND FINISH?

All workshops run from 9:30am to 12:30pm. This includes a 20 minute morning tea break.

WHAT DO THE STUDENTS NEED TO BRING?

Students need to bring a bottle of drinking water and morning tea.

WHAT IS THE COST AND HOW DO I PAY?

The cost of each workshop is \$2 per student to cover materials. This is payable on the day.

If you intend to send more than 10 students a term to workshops, you may arrange for an invoice to be sent to your school. Please let Kirsty know in advance if you wish to choose this option.
